4.0 GO TO 2040 Update – Drew Williams-Clark (CMAP)

Federal regulations mandate the update of GO TO 2040 by October of 2014. Staff are updating the financial plan, major capital projects, indicators, and implementation actions to inform the plan update. These components are expected to be complete in the early spring so that the plan can be drafted for public comment release at the June, 2014 meetings of the CMAP Board and MPO Policy Committee.

a. Updated Implementation Actions - Alex Beata (CMAP)

As part of the GO TO 2040 plan update, the FY 2014 work plan calls for a review of the implementation action tables at the end of each of the twelve chapters in GO TO 2040. Specifically, the work plan calls for these actions to be updated to reflect their implementation status. Alex Beata (CMAP) will present updated implementation action text at this meeting for discussion. Final versions will be presented in February.

5.0 Local Technical Assistance (LTA) Program: Chinatown Community Vision Plan

The fourth largest in the United States, Chicago's Chinatown celebrated its centennial in 2012. To build on this milestone, a coalition of community organizations asked CMAP to help develop Chinatown's first comprehensive vision plan for the neighborhood's core area, in partnership with Alderman Daniel Solis.

The project has just completed its main community engagement phase (unprecedented in scope among LTA projects) and produced a [report on existing conditions in Chinatown](#). With a wealth of information and community input, the project team will now consider areas of focus and potential recommendations for the plan.

Stephen Ostrander (CMAP) will provide an overview of the project and detail key findings that have emerged thus far. Stephen will also discuss challenges and opportunities inherent to the project, and **seeks input from committee members to help guide the team as it enters this crucial phase of the project.**
