One sponsor has requested a project change. The net change in the federal amount programmed resulting from the change is zero.

DuPage County – DuPage County Transit Service Marketing (TIP ID 08-05-0002)

The sponsor is requesting a scope change for the project, to include a free transit fare promotion. The project was originally programmed in FY 2005 for \$480,000 federal (\$600,000 total). The scope of the project was to conduct public outreach/education activities in connection with the DuPage Area Transit Plan. The County is requesting permission to include free fare promotions – specifically, one on route 714, the College of DuPage Connector.

The emissions benefits evaluation of the proposal was based on the general impact of promotions on transit ridership. Hence, the change in scope will not affect the project's ranking against other FY 2005 CMAQ proposals.

Recommendation to the CMAQ Project Selection Committee:

 Consider approving the scope change for DuPage County Transit Service Marketing (TIP ID 08-05-0002), to include free transit fare promotions. The federal amount programmed will remain unchanged.

Dear Mr. Patronsky:

Southwest DuPage benefited significantly from the College of DuPage (COD) Connector – the new Pace Route 714 that serves Wheaton, Naperville, COD, and other key destinations along this critical north-south transit route. As you know, Route 714 is the recipient of a 2005 CMAQ grant that funded Year 1 operations. We greatly appreciate the CMAQ Committee's support for this project.

Following the route's kick-off in August 2006, ridership reached 240 per day in April 2007, and we have a goal of 350 per day by October 2007. To achieve this goal, we plan to use a portion of the CMAQ Transit Service Marketing grant referenced above to promote Route 714 to key markets such as students, apartment residents, and employees. A broad-based partnership comprised of leaders from Naperville, Wheaton, DuPage County, DuPage Mayors and Managers Conference (DMMC), Pace, Metra, RTA, COD, and Illinois Institute of Technology (IIT) meets regularly to develop and implement marketing strategies.

As part of our overall marketing strategy, we propose to provide complimentary fares as a marketing tool for encouraging ridership on Route 714 and to fund this promotion with a portion of the CMAQ grant. These fares would be targeted to students, faculty, and staff at COD, IIT, and North Central College during a back-to-school promotion at the end of August 2007. Per your suggestion to DMMC's Tam Kutzmark, we are seeking your confirmation to proceed with our strategy.

We researched transit marketing efforts and learned that complimentary fares are commonly and successfully used throughout the country to increase transit ridership. For example, the Knoxville Regional Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) used a CMAQ grant to target new riders with complimentary passes in 2005. The TPO saw a 5% increase in ridership during the program and found significant retention in those who received the complimentary passes, which translated into a 15-20% increase in monthly pass sales.

We feel this promotion will maximize our comprehensive marketing strategy and look forward to hearing from you at your earliest convenience. If you have any
