#### 5.0 Freight

MAP-21 includes several new freight provisions, including the establishment of a national Primary Freight Network. CMAP staff will provide an overview of recent efforts at the federal level to implement these provisions, and will also describe staff's freight planning efforts.

#### 6.0 City-Suburban Agreement for the Allocation of Surface Transportation Program Funds

The STP agreement between the City of Chicago and the suburban mayors calls for it to be reviewed following the passage of new

federal transportation authorizing legislation. The need to revise the current agreement will be discussed.
