## 6.0 ON TO 2050 Health Equity Strategy Paper Ricardo Lopez, CMAP Staff

These include strategies to help address unique challenges that communities face, adapt to a changing climate, and promote economic opportunity. With support from the Chicago Community Trust, CMAP partnered with Adler University Institute on Social Inclusion to develop a strategy paper on Health Equity to inform ON TO 2050.
