Development of draft update began in August 2013

Public comment period for draft update over summer 2014

Plan Update Components

Plan update summarizes what has been accomplished since the plan's adoption in October 2010 and where the region should concentrate its efforts moving forward

Analyses conducted for update process include:

- Financial plan for transportation (with forecast updates)
- Major capital projects
- Implementation action areas
- Indicator methodology







Explore innovative financing mechanisms


Implement bus and arterial rapid transit

GO TO 2040 Capital Projects

GO TO 2040 prioritizes maintenance and modernization, followed by strategic enhancements and limited expansions.

Capital project costs represent just 3 percent of region's projected revenue for transportation through 2040.



GO TO 2040 Capital Projects

Balance of transit, highway, and multimodal projects, including:

- CTA Red Line South Extension
- Elgin O'Hare Western Access
- IL 53/120 Tollway
