1.0 Call to Order

The meeting was called to order at 2:00 p.m. by the Chair; members were asked to introduce themselves.

3.0 Approval of the Minutes-October 8, 2014

The minutes of the October 8, 2014 meeting were approved as presented.

4.0 FY 2016 UWP Core and Competitive Proposals

Before opening the discussion related to the Core and Competitive proposals that had been submitted, Chairman Bruce Carmitchel explained that because the federal reauthorization for transportation is due to expire on May 29, IDOT has only identified the funding for FY 2016 based on eight months funding. In addition, the final state allocations that support some UWP allocations will not be determined until the FY 2016 state budget is approved in May or June.

Beginning with the Core program, each of the member agencies presented their respective proposals, gave a brief description of the activity and the cost breakdown, as follows:
