



Background: Project Origins




- Algonquin and Carpentersville submitted joint application to CMAP
- Both Villages had recent subarea plans through LTA
- Both plans recommended utilizing the river for downtown placemaking, recreation, and business attraction
- Project kicked off in July 2014



Background: Existing Plans




- Recent Downtown and Old Town plans see the Fox River as key asset
- Both seek vibrant, mixed-use, walkable downtown development
- Several additional comprehensive plans, park plans, TIF districts, and studies





Background: Study Area



- Parcels directly adjoining the Fox River
- Prairie/Fox River Trail
- Parts of Downtown and Old Town
- Plan will also explore connections outside study area



































Existing Conditions: Governance



GOVERNANCE STRUCTURE

- Project crosses many jurisdictional boundaries
- Corridor is host to a large and active collection of civic groups
- Existing multijurisdictional groups, but none have same boundaries
- River inspires loyalty and civic activity





Existing Conditions: Land Use and Development




- Dominated by open space
- Downtown Algonquin riverfront primarily residential and open space
- Old Town Carpentersville riverfront primarily industrial






Existing Conditions: Transportation and Circulation



- Traffic and roadway design create difficult pedestrian environment
- Western Bypass and proposed Longmeadow Parkway will have major impacts
- Bike trails are popular but could be better connected
- Canoe launches could be improved for safety and access



Existing Conditions: Natural Resources and the Environment



- The Fox River suffers from impaired water quality
- Dams have harmful effects on aquatic habitat
- Corridor boasts significant open space, rare species, and significant habitat
- IDNR recently committed \$2.4 million to FPDKC to remove Carpentersville Dam, but state has suspended funding




Existing Conditions: Key Issues



- Water quality
- Dam removal
- Improved canoe access
- Bike connections to regional trails and open space
- Downtown business development
- Longmeadow Parkway
- Signage and wayfinding




Recommendations: Natural Resources and the Environment



- Pursue collaborative environmental improvement efforts
- Support efforts to remove Carpentersville Dam



Recommendations: Open Space and Recreation



- Plan for changes to the site of Carpentersville Dam
- Explore addition of new recreational amenities
- Improve canoe and kayak launches and portages
- Support motorized boating north of Algonquin Dam



Recommendations: Transportation and Circulation



- Connect bicycle trails to regional network
- Advocate for corridor needs in Longmeadow Parkway process
- Invest in walkability



Recommendations: Placemaking and Economic Development



- Pursue downtown economic development
- Draw people to the Fox River through programming and open space
- Market Fox River as paddling destination
- Develop signage and wayfinding



Some Remaining Questions



- Specific best practices for water quality
- Stormwater management and habitat preservation strategies for open space
- Balance between conservation and recreation
- Mitigating impact of bridge and roadway
- Alternative funding for dam removal
