



Economic benefits of inclusion

Lessons learned

- 1. Greater inclusion is linked to greater growth
- 2. Greater inclusion is linked to longer growth
- 3. Greater inclusion benefits the whole region



Greater growth and inclusion

Metro growth correlated with:

- 1. Immigrant diversity
- 2. Racial inclusion
- 3. Income equality
- 4. Skilled workforce


Growth factors are both economic and social

Regional benefits of inclusion

 - Identify general areas for strategy-making

- Build analytical foundation for strategies
 - How are the areas of concentrated poverty, race, and limited English speaking populations different from other parts of the region?
