


- Percentage of Income Spent on Housing & Transportation by Moderate- and Low-Income Residents


Percentage of Income Spent on Housing and Transportation by Moderate- and Low-Income Residents




Regional Access to Parks per Person in Acres




Percentage of Population Living in Food Deserts




Population Age 25 and Over with an Associate's Degree or Higher
