


Focus groups were convened to discuss issues with experts and stakeholders

Strategies to build expertise of staff and elected officials

- Technical assistance
- Offer trainings to educate, build expertise, and communicate value of priority topics for:
 - Municipal staff
 - Elected officials
 - Appointed officials



Strategies to improve partner networks

- Promote regional and subregional best practices among communities
- Facilitate municipal service sharing and joint purchasing through in-person forums and matchmaking databases hosted by COGs, counties, or other subregional entities
- Promote awareness of partner programs and facilitate connections to topical expertise and resources that aide implementation goals



Strategies to strengthen municipal capacity

- Technical assistance from CMAP, COGs, counties, and other partners
- Consolidate municipal services at the county or subregional level
- Explore municipal consolidation
- Explore municipal partnerships that ease economic competition
- Plan for the future with long range budget forecasts and CIPs
- State should implement programs to encourage consolidation
- Tax policy reforms to improve fiscal resiliency should be implemented
- Implement broad based user fees to meet specific goals, such as local MFTs or stormwater utility fees
