

Inclusive Growth: A Virtuous Cycle


Decreasing inequality will help the Chicago Region achieve stronger, more sustained economic growth.

Real Gross Regional Product Growth in Selected U.S. Regions






Disparate Outcomes by Race/Ethnicity, 2010-14


Key findings from the literature:

- 1. Economic mobility is limited in regions with high degrees of inequality.
- 2. Racial and economic integration can promote regional growth.
- 3. Broad economic growth is also necessary to create opportunities for increased participation.




Inclusive Growth Research

AND


Greater than regional average non-white population

Greater than regional average limited-English proficiency population



Reinvest in disinvested areas


Promote compact development and affordable housing near transit
