

- Capturing benefits for competitive advantage
- Constant innovation


Where we work and live

- More growth near job centers
- Concentration of low- and moderate-incomes in areas with poor job access
- Congestion continues with rising economic costs to supply chains and residents

Potential impacts


- What we earn
 - Real median HH compensation continues to stagnate or even declines
 - Greater labor market polarization

Disproportionate impacts

- Barriers to entry, job insecurity, limited upward mobility
- Insufficient community capacity
- Limiting regional competitiveness

Strategies

- Align education and workforce development with the changing workplace
- Support further growth and concentration in industry clusters
- Modernize the region's transportation network
- Promote economic and process innovation

Strategies

- Ensure efficient, responsive governance
- Improve community capacity and housing security
- Pursue inclusive growth
