Re: ON TO 2050 Update

Media and presentation training was given to staff to prepare for a media outreach campaign that has resulted in multiple print and radio features on Alternative Futures. Print and other supporting material was provided to support dozens of workshops organized by the Outreach department. In addition, communications staff released and promoted the Demographics Snapshot and is close to release of the Freight Snapshot. The communications team continues to work with vendors and plan managers to develop visual assets for the plan and to prepare for the eventual web presentation of ON TO 2050.
