
Local Food Memo

 A diversified agricultural economy and the availability of healthful food are critical components of a resilient region


 Understanding agriculture's relationship to the region's economy and food system security is important when making land use decisions.


 Developing an understanding of the geographic relationship between food access, demographics, transportation, and community vulnerability is important for local planners.

















Food Access

Land Conversion

- 140,000 acres of agricultural and natural lands developed (2001-2015)
- 1.7% increase in the developed area of the region
- Farmland conservation activity has increased

Local Food Memo – Context and Progress

GO TO 2040

Goals:

- Promote sustainable local food
 - Facilitate local food production
 - Increase access to healthy food
 - Raise understanding and awareness of nutrition and food policy

Indicators:

- Acreage of land in the region being used to harvest food for human consumption
- Value/percentage value of agricultural products sold directly to individuals for human consumption in the region
- Percentage of population living in food deserts
