## 3.1 ON TO 2050: Draft Plan

CMAP staff (Elizabeth Schuh) will present on the status of the ON TO 2050 Draft Plan. The Plan, following three years in preparation, builds its recommendations on the three principles of Inclusive Growth, Resilience, and Prioritized Investment. Staff will describe the goals and recommendations across the five chapters of the plan. Following the plan's release for public comment on June 15th, CMAP staff and Board will spend the summer months soliciting input and verifying the recommendations of the Plan, prior to final adoption in October.

The guide focuses on road and facility design that aim to improve conditions for bicycling and walking in suburban communities and smaller town and more rural contexts, providing design solutions and guidelines that are tailored to their needs.

To date, Access to Transit has funded projects in 22 communities throughout the region for a total investment of roughly \$10 million. The call for projects is now open with a deadline of August 31, 2018.
