#### 1.0 Call to Order/Introductions

The meeting was called to order at 10:05 a.m.

#### 2.0 Agenda Changes and Announcements

There were no changes to the agenda or announcements.

#### 3.0 Approval of Minutes – May 13, 2013

Jennifer Becker (KKCM) moved to approve minutes and Mary Keating (DuPage County) seconded. The minutes were unanimously approved.

#### 4.0 Fair Housing and Equity Assessment Update

CMAP staff Kendra Smith and Rob Breymeier of The Chicago Area Fair Housing Alliance (CAFHA) project team returned to the Committee to provide an update about the Fair Housing and Equity Assessment. The Assessment addresses segregation and race; evaluates the current state of fair housing in the region; and provides recommendations to affirmatively further fair housing through GO TO 2040.

The recommendations included the Assessment call for recommendations at the regional and local government levels. Recommendations also address Local Technical Assistance (LTA) projects and the need to invest in disinvested communities.

#### **5.0 Loyola University Hospital System Community Health Needs Assessment**

Nahlah Daddino, Director of Community Benefits for Loyola University Health System (LUHS), presented an overview of LUHS's recently completed comprehensive Community Health Needs Assessment (CHNA) and implementation planning process. The year-long process looked at broad health concerns and barriers across 22 municipalities surrounding LUHS's two hospital sites: Loyola University Medical Center in Maywood and Gottlieb Memorial Hospital in Melrose Park.

Ms. Daddino began her presentation with background information about LUHS, whose service area spans several CMAP counties. The Affordable Care Act requires CHNA every 3 years and the state's requirements are even broader. The Illinois Public Health Institute compiled the data portion of the LUHS's CHNA.

The Assessment found that half of the population were uninsured or Medicaid recipients. West Suburban Cook County fares worse in health issues than suburban Cook as a whole. Diabetes, hypertension, high cholesterol, obesity are highest among self-reported issues. Priorities identified in the CHNA include improving access to healthcare services and reducing the rate of obesity. There is a three-year implementation plan to continue existing programs and community partners, launch foundational program.
