



The Council of Mayors Executive Committee met on Tuesday, January 29, 2013.

An update of the 2013-2017 STP Marks with revised allotments was presented by CMAP staff and approved by the committee. The councils have spent \$72.54 million in STP funding, or 72.9% of the councils 2012 mark. The committee also approved \$6.17 million in advanced funding requests for Central, DuPage and McHenry councils. The 2014 Council of Mayors Unified Work Program (UWP) application, including scope of work and budget, was approved for submission to the UWP Committee. Staff provided an update on October 2012 CMAQ status reports showing 24 projects were deferred due to missed accomplishment goals. In total, \$230 million in CMAQ funds have been obligated in federal fiscal year 2012. The committee was informed that there have been meetings with officials from Plano, Sandwich and DeKalb and Kane County discussing the proposed Metropolitan Planning Area expansion and the impacts to their communities. Staff shared results from the 2012 municipal survey with the committee. The survey is one of the tools used to measure progress towards implementing GO TO 2040 and to help identify issues that communities would like to learn more about. CMAP's state legislative framework and agenda were presented. Formation of the MAP-21 sub-committee of the MPO Policy Committee was announced.

There were presentations on roadway functional class revisions, the Get America to Work Coalition and CMAP's Industry Cluster Drill Down Report: Manufacturing. The functional class revision presentation provided a description of the process that is used to determine a roadway's functional class. Joe Costello, Executive Director of the RTA, requested that the committee join the Get America to Work Coalition, which advocates for funding to bring transit systems across the country to a state of good repair. The committee unanimously approved joining this coalition. The presentation on the Industry Cluster Drill Down: Manufacturing summarized the major findings of the report and will be presented in its entirety on February 27th at Harper Valley College.
