
# 2022 CALL FOR PROJECTS







### Summary of applications received

**70** total applications received from **50** different applicants

**55** applications will be evaluated by CMAP, **15** applications will be evaluated by RTA

We received applications from local governments, community organizations, and government agencies

Many applications are from cohort 3 and 4 communities

- Remaining applications evaluated by Evaluation Committee to determine fourth round group


Phase three - interview

- Leadership Committee determines final approved list based on external input and resource budgets

- PMs and Project Teams assigned
- •ED approval
- •Letters sent to non-selected applicants
- Award letters, charters and IGAs sent to selected applicants

Phase five - final approval








### **CMAP** evaluation process
