6.0 GO TO 2040 Implementation: Technical Assistance

The implementation of GO TO 2040 will involve local technical assistance directed to communities across the region. The recent federal Sustainable Communities Regional Planning grant received by CMAP, as well as other agency resources, will be used for this purpose. Staff will provide an overview of the expected scope of CMAP's technical assistance work during the remainder of SFY 11, including descriptions of the proposed processes for allocating resources to local projects.

#### 9.0 CMAQ

#### 9.1 Removal of CMAQ Projects

The CMAQ policies for active program management call for status updates in May and October. After reviewing the responses, the CMAQ Project Selection Committee recommends 4 projects for removal in the amount of \$2,406,329 in federal funds.

#### 9.2 CMAQ Programming Policies

The CMAQ policies for active program management specify procedures for monitoring project status, and actions to be taken if a project is not progressing. The CMAQ Project Selection Committee reviewed these policies following the first year of their use and recommends revisions to strengthen them.

#### 9.3 CMAQ Recommended Programming Approach

With the adoption of GO TO 2040 the CMAQ Project Selection Committee recommends approval of a revised programming process. The revised process considers how projects will implement goals established by GO TO 2040 along with the primary goals of improving air quality and mitigating congestion. The draft policy is attached for your consideration. ACTION REQUESTED: Approval and direction

#### 10.0 MetroPulse Demo

In partnership with the Chicago Community Trust, the MetroPulse website was launched in mid-November, www.metropulsechicago.org. This web system is part of the Regional Indicators Project to track progress on implementing GO TO 2040's recommendations and to develop a powerful interface to access a vast warehouse containing data on the factors that shape quality of life in the seven-county region. Staff will give an overview of the website and a brief tutorial to utilizing its features. ACTION REQUESTED: Discussion
