WHEREAS, the Policy Committee is the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for northeastern Illinois, designated by the Governor, as being responsible together with the State of Illinois, and public transportation operators, for carrying out the provisions of Section 134 Title 23 U.S. Code and Sections 5303-06 Title 49 U.S. Code; and

WHEREAS, 23 U.S. Code 134(h) and 49 U.S. Code 5304 require the Metropolitan Planning Organization to develop a Transportation Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the *Federal Register* provides a combined northeastern Illinois/northwestern Indiana FFY 2010 apportionment for Section 5307 and Section 5340 combined; and

WHEREAS, the determination of subarea apportionments is to be accomplished by local agreement; and

WHEREAS, the split of the apportionment is essential to the development of the Transportation Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, an agreement has been reached between northeastern Illinois and northwestern Indiana proposing to sub-allocate the total FFY 2010 apportionment of Section 5307 and Section 5340 combined funds available to the Chicago, Illinois/Indiana UZA through an extension of a letter of understanding as follows: (i) 4.280961 % to northwestern Indiana, and (ii) 95.719039 % to northeastern Illinois, contingent upon the approval of the Regional Transportation Authority Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, the agreement between northeastern Illinois and northwestern Indiana further proposes that the required one percent Transit Enhancement set-aside be allocated between northeastern Illinois and northwestern Indiana pro rata, in proportion to the percentage of the total FFY 2010 apportionment of Section 5307 and Section 5340 combined funds available to the Chicago, Illinois/Indiana UZA received by each of northeastern Illinois and northwestern Indiana.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT: the Policy Committee hereby endorses the proposed allocation of funds, including the allocation of the one percent Transit

Enhancement set-aside, between northwestern Indiana and northeastern Illinois as set forth above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT: the Secretary of the Policy Committee is hereby authorized and directed to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Regional Administrator of the Federal Transit Administration.

A RESOLUTION ENDORSING THE NORTHEASTERN ILLINOIS/SOUTHEASTERN WISCONSIN SUBAREA ALLOCATION OF THE FY 2010 FEDERAL TRANSIT ADMINISTRATION SECTION 5307 AND SECTION 5340 COMBINED APPORTIONMENT

WHEREAS, the Policy Committee is the Metropolitan Planning Organization (MPO) for northeastern Illinois, designated by the Governor, as being responsible together with the State of Illinois, and public transportation operators, for carrying out the provisions of Section 134 Title 23 U.S. Code and Sections 5303-06 Title 49 U.S. Code; and

WHEREAS, 23 U.S. Code 134(h) and 49 U.S. Code 5304 require the Metropolitan Planning Organization to develop a Transportation Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, the *Federal Register* provides a combined northeastern Illinois/southeastern Wisconsin FFY 2010 apportionment for Section 5307 and Section 5340 combined; and

WHEREAS, the determination of subarea apportionments is to be accomplished by local agreement; and

WHEREAS, the split of the apportionment is essential to the development of the Transportation Improvement Program; and

WHEREAS, an agreement has been reached between northeastern Illinois and southeastern Wisconsin proposing to sub-allocate the total FFY 2010 apportionment of Section 5307 and Section 5340 combined funds available to the Chicago, Illinois/Indiana UZA through an extension of a letter of understanding as follows: (i) 2.200891% to southeastern Wisconsin, and (ii) 97.799109% to northeastern Illinois, contingent upon the approval of the Regional Transportation Authority Board of Directors; and

WHEREAS, the agreement between northeastern Illinois and southeastern Wisconsin further proposes that the required one percent Transit Enhancement set-aside be allocated between northeastern Illinois and southeastern Wisconsin pro rata, in proportion to the percentage of the total FFY 2010 apportionment of Section 5307 and Section 5340 combined funds available to the Chicago, Illinois/Indiana UZA received by each of northeastern Illinois and southeastern Wisconsin.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT: the Policy Committee hereby endorses the proposed allocation of funds, including the allocation of the one percent Transit

Enhancement set-aside, between southeastern Wisconsin and northeastern Illinois as set forth above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED THAT: the Secretary of the Policy Committee is hereby authorized and directed to transmit a certified copy of this resolution to the Regional Administrator of the Federal Transit Administration.
