### Election Update:

Election Day was November 2, and several local, state, and federal seats were up for reelection. House Democrats gained two new seats – Districts 17 and 56; keeping Democrats in control of the house (72 Democrats and 46 Republicans). Democrats also retained control of the Senate despite losing a seat in Lake County. In addition to the district seats, there was 105 referenda on the November ballot; 42 dealt with support for statewide pension reform. The results of the elected offices and referenda of interest are listed at the end of the document.

### Veto Sessions:

Veto sessions have been set for both chambers. The Senate returned on Thursday, November 4 to address pension bonding via [SB 3415](#), this bill was Held in Senate Executive Committee. Beginning on Tuesday, November 16, both chambers will return to take action on some vetoed legislation, none of which are of direct interest to CMAP. In total, the Governor vetoed two bills, made 17 amendatory vetoes, and 1 line item veto. Additionally, the General Assembly could possibly address other issues, such as pension reform, RTA inspector general, rainwater harvesting, and gaming to support the capital bill. CMAP will track and monitor all relevant legislation.

### Spring Session:

CMAP is evaluating many of the recommendations in GO TO 2040 to determine a legislative strategy for the spring 2011 and beyond. Some of these initiatives include, but are not limited to the Comprehensive Regional Planning fund, motor fuel tax, public-private partnerships, transportation cost and investment efficiencies, water and energy conservation, and adequate funding for natural resources agencies. Many of our partner organizations have carry over initiatives that are aligned to the recommendations and CMAP will continue to support these. CMAP staff would like to discuss with the committee those initiatives and new legislative initiatives that your organizations will be supporting for the spring.
