Implementation Examples:

- The City of Chicago released its data portal in 2011 at https://data.cityofchicago.org/. The website is host to over 900 dataset variations in multiple formats that provide information about City departments, services, facilities and performance.
- Cook County released its data portal in the same year at http://data.cookcountyil.gov/. It similarly provides over 200 datasets for download. These range from foreclosures to budget information.
- The state of Illinois used the same platform as Chicago and Cook County to create its data portal at https://data.illinois.gov/. The state also created data microsites on Rockford, Champaign, Belleville, and the South Suburban Mayors and Managers Association, which can be viewed at the same URL.
- All three of the above portals have been "federated" at <u>https://www.metrochicagodata.org/</u>, which means that data posted on any of the individual sites can be searched and accessed at this new URL.

Rationale for Retain/Revise/Complete/Delete Assessment:

• Many local governments within the region and state departments have made great strides in posting administrative data online since the adoption of GO TO 2040. Perhaps most remarkable are the open data portals created by the City of Chicago and Cook County, both of which provide access to a wide variety of data online.

Implementation Action Area #3: Provide Direct Technical Assistance and Conduct Data Sharing Pilot Programs

Recommendation: Delete

Rationale: The technology for visualizing and distributing data over the web is constantly changing and evolving. Several units of government have created open data portals over the past several years, including Cook County and the City of Chicago. Each county and municipality will have different goals, indicators, and targets to monitor. As an authoritative source of data and information, CMAP will continue to remain active and engaged in this topic. However prescribing a method to provide technical assistance or creating pilot programs are not effective strategies for increasing access to information across the region, given the diverse needs of our communities. CMAP will also continue to encourage the distribution of public data online by posting original data created by the agency, updating community data snapshots, and periodically refreshing regional indicators data to monitor the implementation of GO TO 2040. comp
