Background

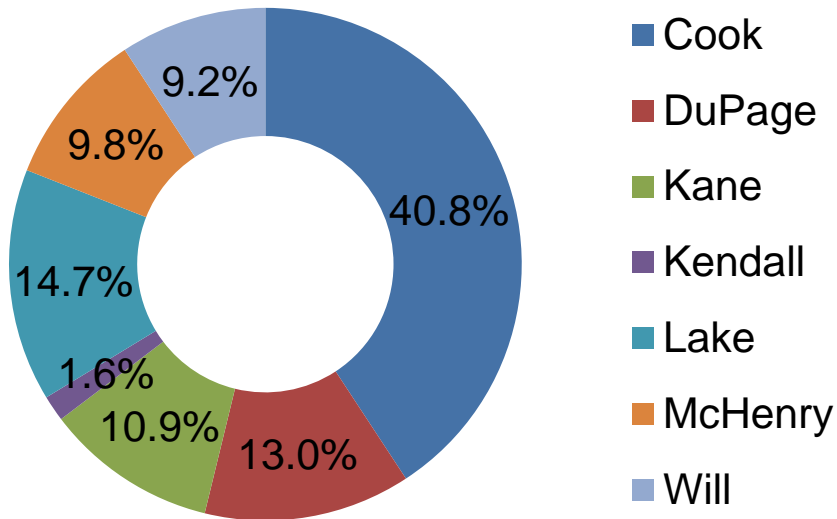
- Biennial since 2010

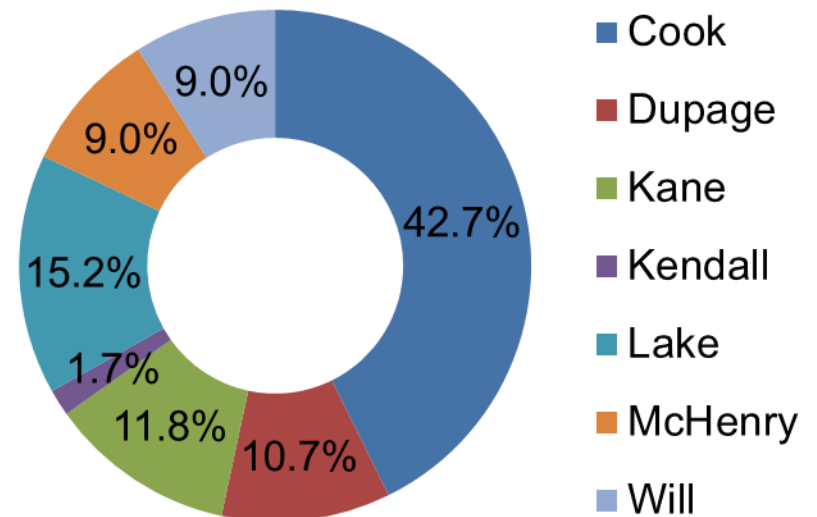

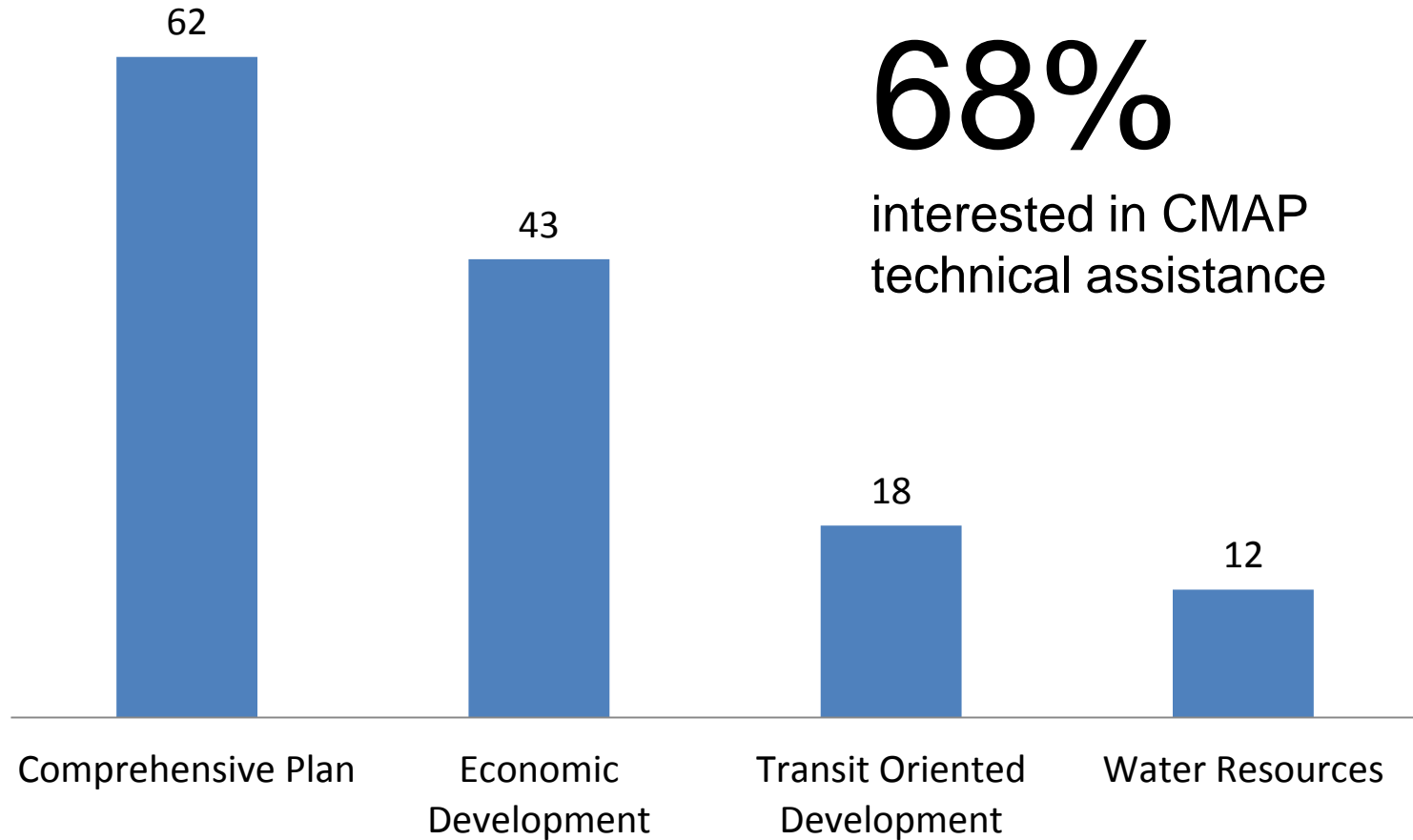
Percent of Survey Respondents by County 2012



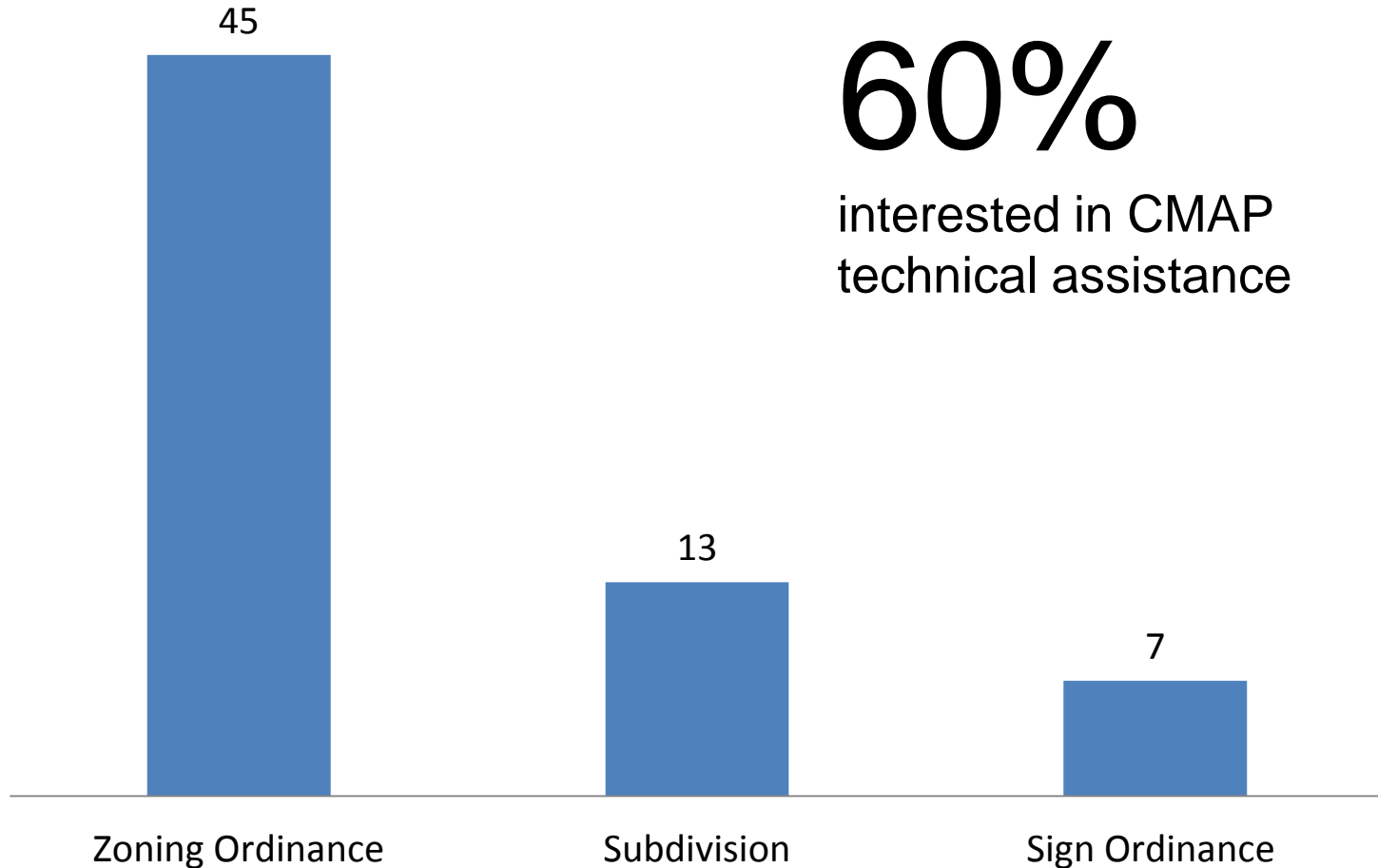
Percent of Survey Respondents County 2014

Priority Regulatory Projects

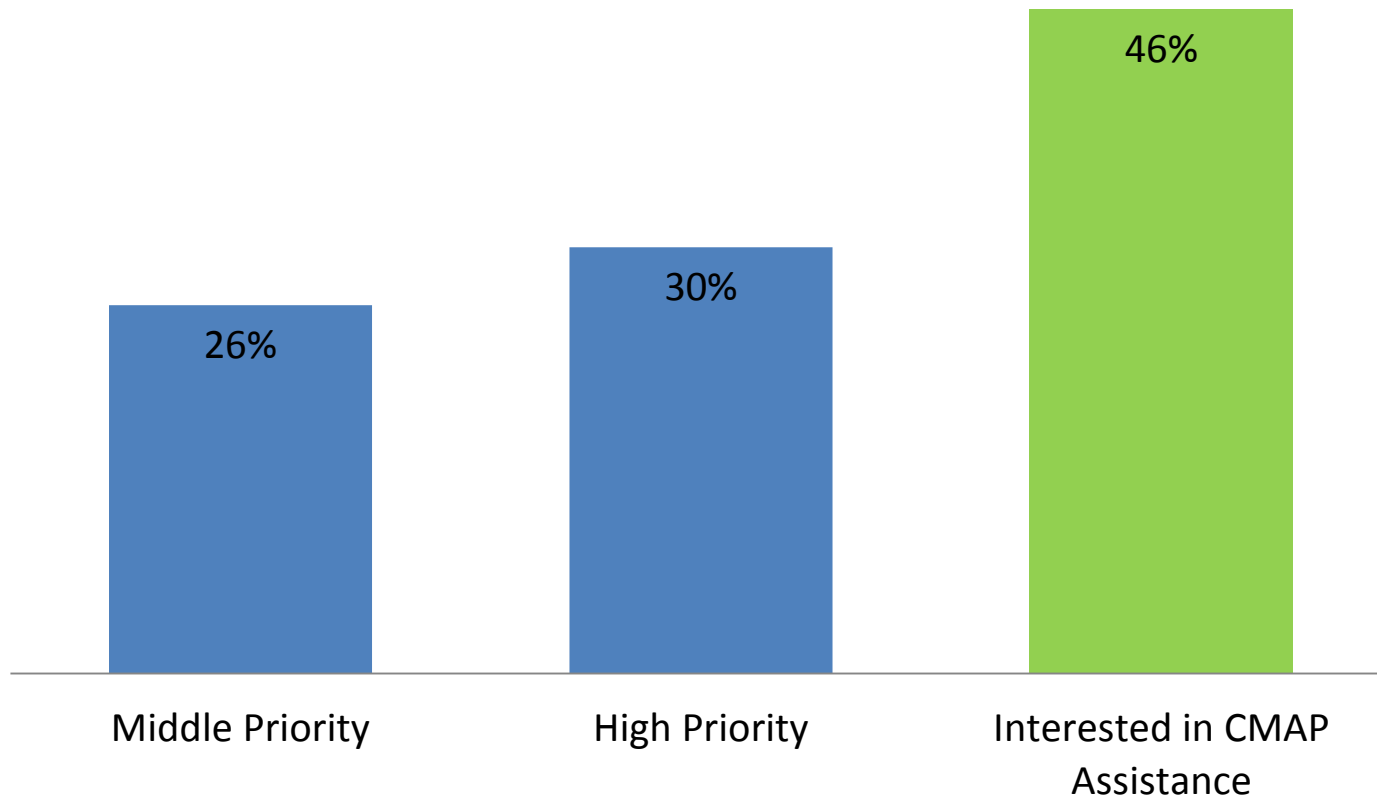


Gauging demand for implementation projects

- The model plans, ordinances, and codes project will be used for internal research and development of topics identified by the municipal survey.

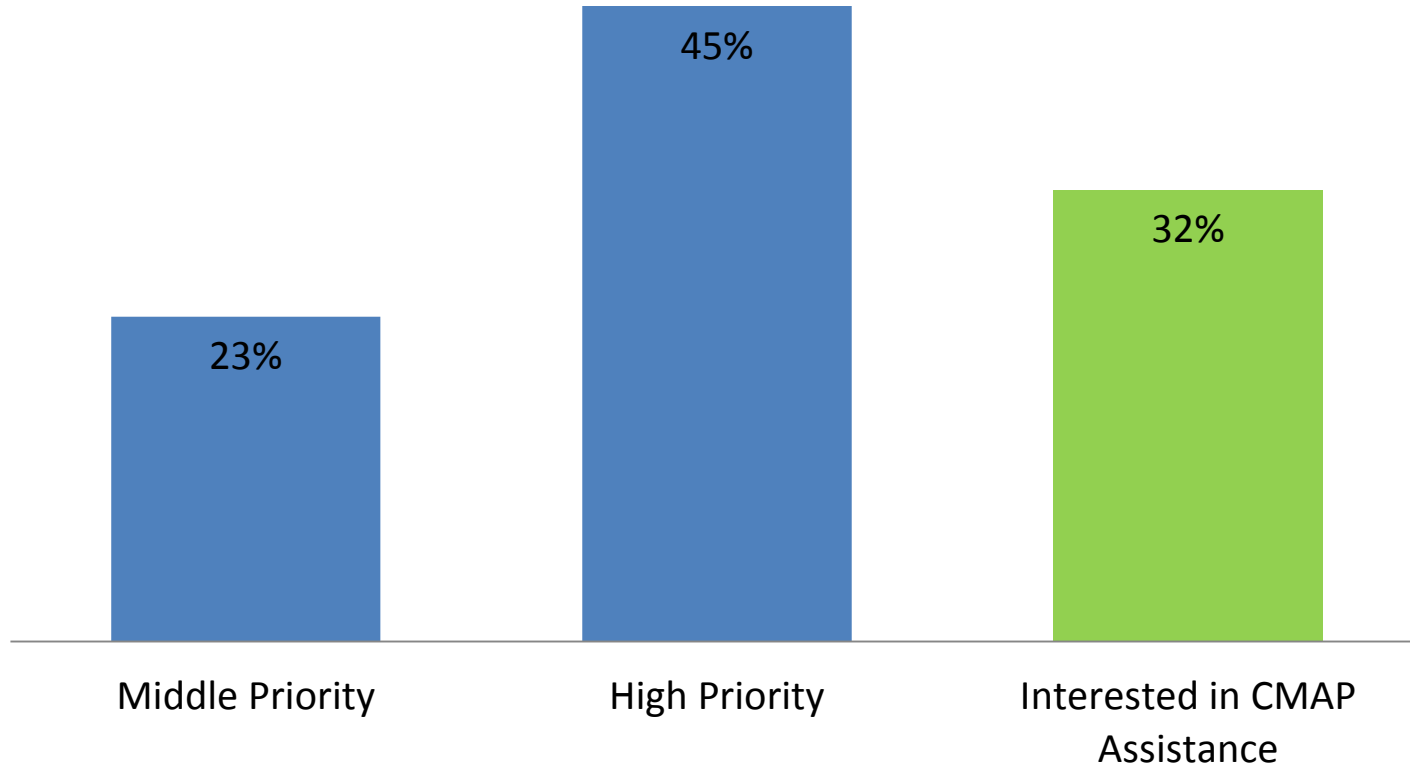

Produce a Strategic Plan in the Next Two Years



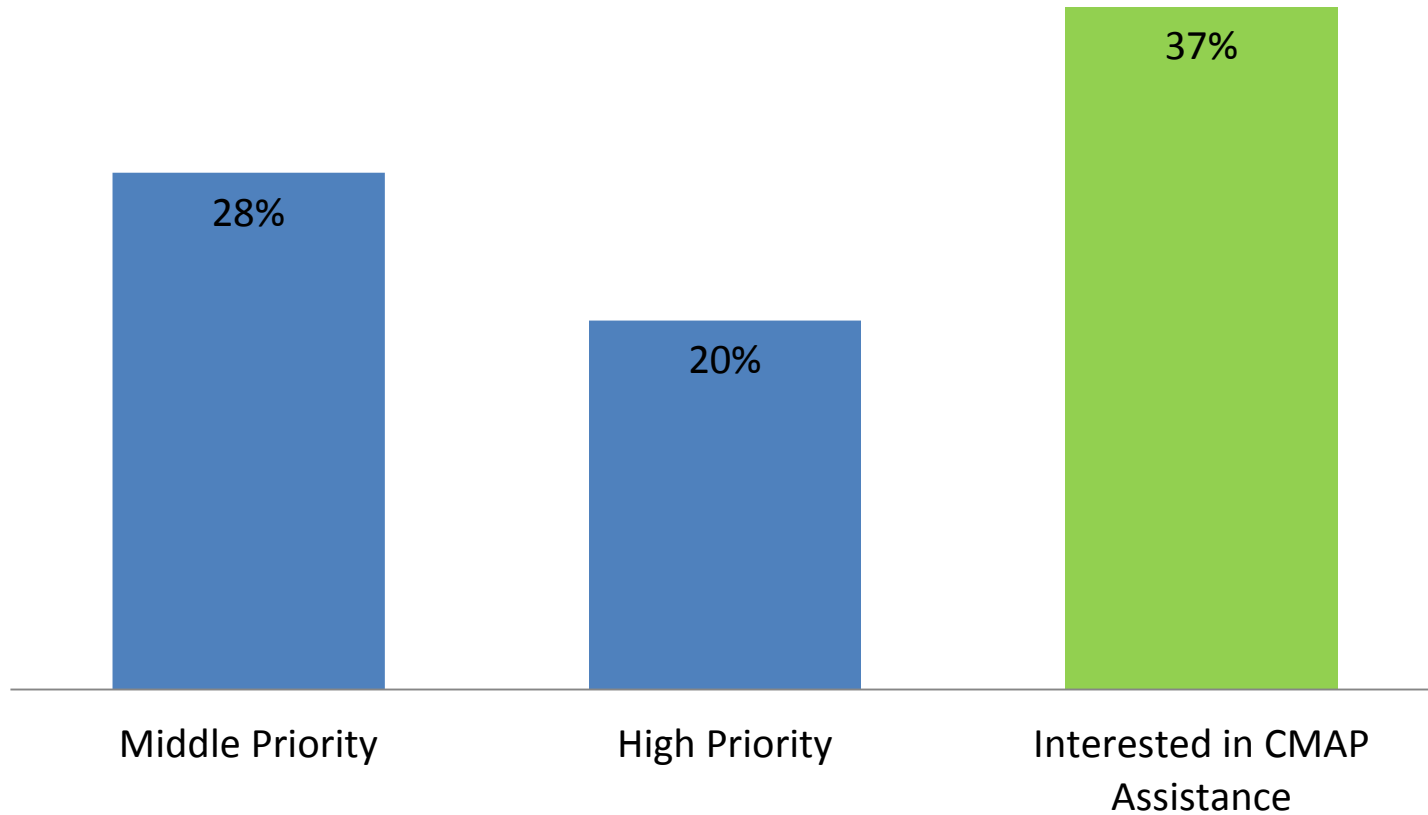
Implementation Project: Capital Improvement Program (CIP)

Develop or Update a CIP in the Next Two Years



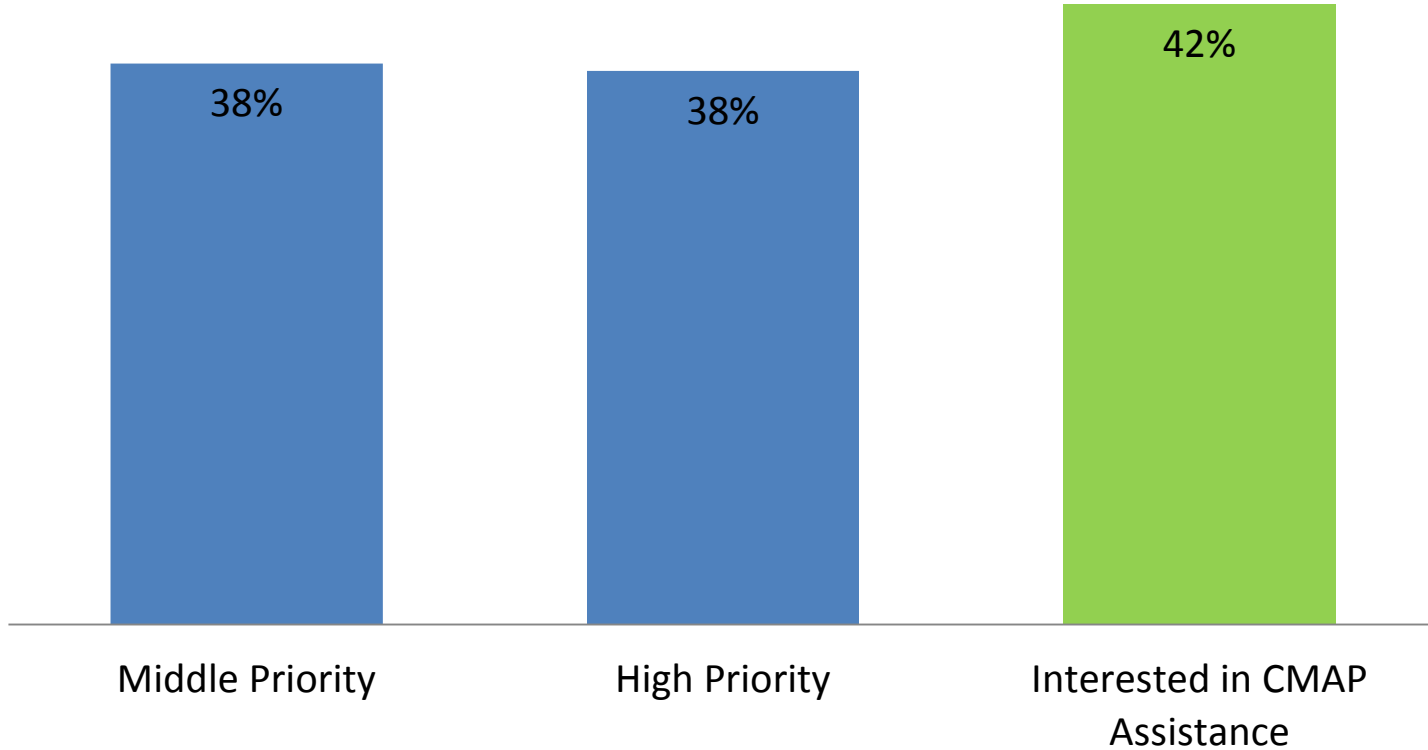
Implementation Project: Attract Development to a Specific Site
