On behalf of the Forest Preserve District of DuPage County, I am pleased to submit this letter of support as part of the application for Local Technical Assistance Program funding for a feasibility study of the central portion of the East Branch DuPage River Trail.

The District is committed to developing and connecting trails in communities throughout DuPage County. For many years, though, without a north-south route to link to the network of existing county trails, the central part of DuPage has been underserved. The East Branch DuPage River Trail will provide this crucial north-south path.

A feasibility study will move the project closer to construction by solidifying a preferred alignment for the central portion of the trail, identifying sensitive environmental features, and engaging communities to build consensus among local leadership. In support of the study, the District is willing to commit funding toward the grant's local match-funding requirement.

The heart of the 28-mile East Branch DuPage River Trail will be a critical segment with significant benefits and a catalyst for the implementation of the remaining sections. It will connect multiple underserved communities to several hundred miles of regional trails, including the Illinois Prairie Path, Great Western Trail and Southern DuPage Regional Trail, and will create transportation alternatives for commuting, shopping and tourism. It will also connect neighborhoods to hundreds of acres of open space within DuPage County's forest preserves, creating recreational opportunities for residents while promoting healthy lifestyles.

The District looks forward to collaborating with DuPage County and its partners to help make this project a reality and success.
